Our MA Inclusion and SEND is designed for those who work in any field of education, with an interest in inclusion and special educational needs and disability.

The modules support professional development through investigation of current issues in inclusion and SEND in the context of values-led leadership. This MA will enable students to develop and improve their knowledge and leadership skills, enhance their professional profile and engage in rigorous research and high level enquiry.

Students are able to take an extra module after their dissertation to achieve the National Award for SEN Coordination.

Cost for 2020-21: £1000 per 30 credit module
