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Policy Update/Implementation



As all colleagues will be aware, over the last few weeks the Trust has been consulting with employees on four employment policy documents:

- Maternity
- Adoption
- Paternity
- Shared Parental Leave

The intention of the revised policies and procedures is to provide closer alignment across the Trust. Representatives of Trade Unions, leadership teams, and Trust Board have been involved in the development of the documents prior to the formal consultation period for employees which concluded on Wednesday 3rd July 2019.

Employees were offered the opportunity to provide feedback and reflections on the policies and their implementation, while no specific feedback was raised with the HR team on these documents, the team did liaise with individuals on specific queries to entitlements. In addition, some minor amendments to the policy documents have been made to aid interpretation.

The final documents will shortly be uploaded to the staff portal WeST website for all employees to view. You may recall in recent Wednesday Whistle articles we have launched a new staff portal area for key employment documents and information on the website and your local senior school administrator can share the password for all employees to access from any internet device.

In addition, the documents and supporting toolkits will be available from the HR Resources folder for Headteachers / Principals and Seniors Leaders to review. If you have not been able to access this folder area please liaise with HR and ICT for support.

The documents will also be circulated for school systems / records to be updated. Key to the implementation plans will be the communication of the revised documents.

Thank you to all who have supported the communication of these key updates across the Trust. The documents will become **effective from 11th July 2019 onwards** and therefore form part of the employment contract for all employees.

These policies will provide the foundation for working towards closer alignment across the Trust and further documents are currently under development. Once the draft documents are prepared they will also be circulated for employee consultation.

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Carnegie Book Awards 2019



On the 18th of June the Ivybridge Community College Learning Resource Centre hosted their annual Carnegie Shadowing Event. Carnegie is a children's book award established in 1936.

Students were encouraged to read as many of the eight shortlisted books as possible so they could present their favourite one in an effort to convince others of their brilliance. This year, three of the eight books were free-verse novels. This means they were written as poetry but read like a novel.

Many people can be put off by poetry but actually these books were fresh, insightful, and surprisingly easy to read, not to mention beautiful written and incredibly emotive.

Once again students were amazingly creative; we had a movie trailer, comic books, puppet shows, 3D models, and theatrical re-enactments. We shared some of the students' work online and had very positive responses from the authors themselves! Sophie Anderson, writer of *The House with Chicken Legs*, loved Poppy, Libby, and Harriett's puppet show, and Frances Hardinge was amazed by Willow's atmospheric graphic novel pages.



This year we had even more student involvement as two primary school students joined us from The Erme. Rather than judge the Carnegie medal nominated books for young adults, Laurence and Oliver read all the Kate Greenaway books nominated for their beautiful illustrations. Despite coming to the College only a few times before, these two boys bravely presented their favourites books in front of our 30 students with confidence and charm. They had created their own artwork inspired by the books and were only a little bit crestfallen when their chosen favourites didn't win.



The winners were *Lost Words* illustrated by Jackie Morris and written by Robert Macfarlane, and *The Poet X* by Elizabeth Acevedo – both books of poetry. Unlike last year our students were very happy with the result and even better, Dominican-American slam poet Elizabeth Acevedo has now become the first ever writer of colour to win this prestigious children's books award. Acevedo wanted to write books where young girls of colour could see themselves represented in a real way.

The day was a wonderful success and we hope that more students will be convinced to read free-verse novels; we definitely think it will be the next big trend!

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Recycling Beyond the Sea

Yealmpton Primary School has been working with Amigos After School Club on a recycling project to raise awareness of our consumption of single use plastic, recycling plastic and paper within school and at home.

Our week long arts and science project started with the school signing up to The Plastic Investigator club where every child became an agent, committing to solve the nation's plastic problem (a scheme run by the National Schools Partnership and Asda). After a series of missions, children were tasked to design a plastic recycling poster as part of a nationwide competition. First prize is worth £20,000 for the school and a £1,000 gift card!

We then became recycling exhibition artists to create a 'Beyond the Sea recycling exhibition for our central courtyard, linking with our end of term concert theme.

Our Amigos Eco Warriors chose animals for us to make using recycled plastic that each class had collected the week before. We had recycled turtles, jelly fish, octopus, fish, CD fish, a waterfall to name but a few. Our final exhibition looks amazing and really tells the story of the effects of plastics on our oceans.
