


gramme. All in all, we are having a really busy and exciting time and we would like to take this opportunity to wish everyone in our community a wonderful Christmas!

Policy Update / Implementation

As all colleagues will be aware, over the last few months the Trust has been consulting on a series of revised employment policy documents:

- Dignity at Work Policy and Procedure
- Redeployment Policy and Procedure
- Code of Conduct
- And supporting social media employee guidance

The intention of the revised policies and procedures is to provide closer alignment across the Trust. Representatives of Trade Unions, leadership teams, and Trust Board have been involved in the development of the documents prior to the formal consultation period for employees.

Employees were offered the opportunity to provide feedback and reflections on the policies and their implementation, one of the key areas raised was regarding the difference in pay protection arrangements/durations for support staff and teachers. This difference is reflective of the differences in national terms and conditions and the Trust commitment to maintaining these.

The final documents have been uploaded to the staff portal WeST website for all employees to view. You may recall earlier this year we launched a new staff portal area for key employment documents and information on the WeST website and your local senior school administrator can share the password for all employees to access from any internet device or please contact HR on hr@westst.org.uk.

In addition, the documents and supporting toolkits will be available from the HR Resources folder for Headteachers / Principals and Seniors Leaders to review. If you have not been able to access this folder area please liaise with HR and ICT for support.

The documents will also be circulated for school systems / records to be updated. Key to the implementation plans will be the communication of the revised documents.

Thank you to all who have supported the communication of these key updates across the Trust. The documents became effective from the date of Trust Board adoption 12th December 2019 onwards and therefore form part of the employment contract for all employees.

These policies will provide the foundation for working towards closer alignment across the Trust and further documents are currently under development. Once the draft documents are prepared they will also be circulated for employee consultation.
