

Pupil Premium Funding

Pupil Premium Strategy

All academies are required to publish information about the pupil premium strategy.

DfE recommend publication of following information for the current academic year:

- How much pupil premium funding the school received for this academic year
- Details of the main barriers to educational achievement that the disadvantaged students in your school face
- How you will spend your pupil premium funding to overcome these barriers and the reason for the approach you have chosen
- How you will measure the effect of the pupil premium strategy
- The date of the next pupil premium strategy review.

For the previous academic year, DfE recommend publication of the following information:

- How you have spent your pupil premium funding
- The effect that the pupil premium had on pupils.

Pupil premium funding falls into 3 categories:

- DPP—Deprivation —linked to FSM eligibility including FSM Ever 6
- SPP—Service—linked to children of regular forces personnel
- LAP—Looked After—linked to children currently in LA care, adopted from LA care or subject to a specific order.

The school pupil premium strategy should clearly identify the planned use of each element of the funding however should not identify individual learners.

Education Endowment Foundation (EEF) Teaching and Learning Toolkit provides guidance on a range of strategies that could be considered. If you are visiting the EEF website It is also worth

reading up on the promising project page where EEF, often in partnership with high profile education sponsors, outline projects that have been trialed and subject to EEF evaluation.

Year 7 Literacy and Numeracy Catch-up Strategy

If your school receives year 7 literacy and numeracy catch-up funding you must publish details of how you spend this funding and the impact that this has had on the attainment and progress of pupils who attract it.

You must include:

- How much year 7 catch-up premium you received for the current financial year
- Details of how you intend to spend the funding
- Details of how you spent the year 7 catch-up premium in the last financial year
- How last year's allocation made a difference to the attainment and progress of the pupils who benefit from the funding.
